PROF DR ULF ENGEL

Leipzig University / Addis Ababa University

Ulf Engel is Professor in Politics in Africa at the Institute of African Studies, Leipzig University, Germany. He is also a Visiting Professor at the Institute for Peace and Security Studies at Addis Ababa University, Ethiopia, and Professor Extraordinary in the Department of Political Science at Stellenbosch University, South Africa. Since 2006, he has served as advisor to the African Union's Department of Political Affairs, Peace and Security in the fields of conflict prevention, early warning, preventive diplomacy, and knowledge management. Engel is editor of the *Yearbook on the African Union*, published since 2021 with Brill (Leiden/Boston).



PROF BHEKI MNGOMEZULU

Bheki Mngomezulu is a full Professor of Political Science and International Relations. He has recently joined Nelson Mandela University as the new Director of the Centre for the Advancement of Non-Racialism and Democracy (CANRAD). He holds seven academic qualifications from three South African universities and two from Rice University in Texas, USA. He has been a Visiting Professor at universities in Romania and Sweden. His books include *The President for Life Pandemic in Africa* (2013) and *Foreign Policy Posture in Post-Apartheid South Africa: Consistencies and Ambiguities* (2020).

Dikeledi Mokoena has BA, Hons and MA degrees from Wits University, and a certificate in African Political Economy from UNISA. She is awaiting graduation for a PhD in Political Science at the University of Pretoria. She has seven years of lecturing experience, and was a facilitator for nine years and a researcher for 11 years. To date, Mokoena has trained almost 2000 young leaders from 55 African countries, focusing on Pan-Africanism, intersectional leadership and governance. She has consulted at various international organisations, including the African Union.
